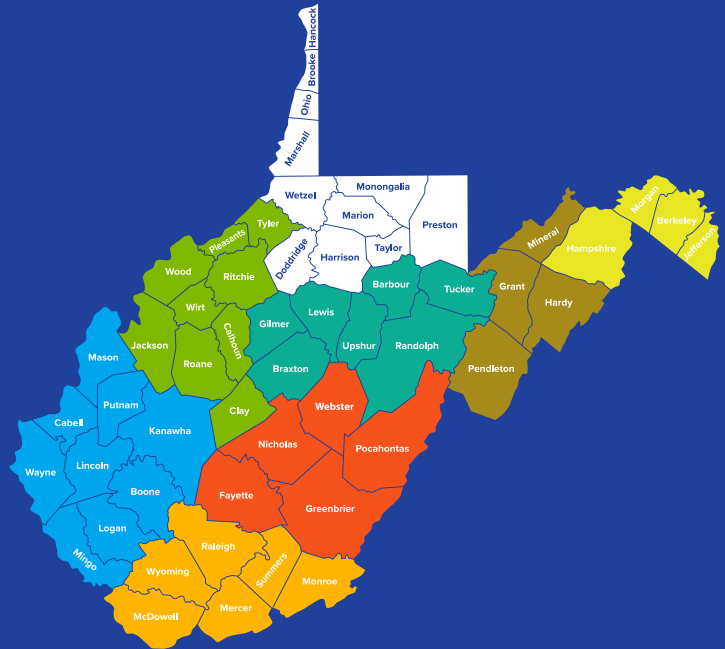

The WVCA membership has now grown to 525 strong—surpassing our 2025 goal of 500 by 5%. This is a tremendous accomplishment, and it reflects the dedication, engagement and pride of cattle producers across West Virginia. We also want to lift up and thank Kevin Shaffer, our executive director, for his excellent leadership throughout the year. Kevin's steady guidance has strengthened our organization, supported member needs and helped WVCA continue its forward momentum.

Because of this growth, WVCA was recognized as the second-highest membership-growing cattlemen's association in the Northeast region, earning \$1,056 back from NCBA for our efforts. This accomplishment shows what we can achieve when we work together—and we hope to continue building on this momentum.

West Virginia Cattlemen Tour Kentucky

After many years without an association-led tour, 30 producer members of the West Virginia Cattlemen's Association toured several cattle operations in Kentucky over two days in October.

The trip was the first of what many WVCA members hope returns to annual event. Prior to this trip, the association had not hosted a producer tour in at least 15 years. Kevin Shaffer, executive director and the WVCA board decided to bring the trips back this year. Over the past year, association's membership has grown and enthusiasm is returning.

In Kentucky, WVCA members toured the Blue Grass Stockyards in Lexington, Robert L. Conley Livestock in Georgetown and Stone Gate Farms in Flemingsburg.

"It's pretty amazing to see the set up they have here," said Kim Getz, WVCA board member and tour participant from Sherr said of the Blue Grass Stockyards in Lexington. "We don't have anything this size back home."

Ivy Ward, WVCA board member and trip participant from Peeltree, said she went on the trip to make new connections and network.

"My grandparents went on these tours years ago, and it's amazing the amount of people that they talk to because they met them on a cattlemen's tour," she said. "It's cool for me to be able to be here in my 20s and be able to do the same things that they did all those years ago."

Getz went on the trip with his wife Becky. Prior to this trip, Becky Getz was the last executive director of the West Virginia Cattlemen's Association to organize a producer trip for the association. Both said they are happy the tours are returning.

"These trips are something a lot of cattlemen look forward to years ago," Kim Getz said. "I'm happy they are doing it again."

"It's really about fellowship," Becky Getz said. "It's a way for producers to justify getting off the farm, seeing and learning new things, and meeting new people."

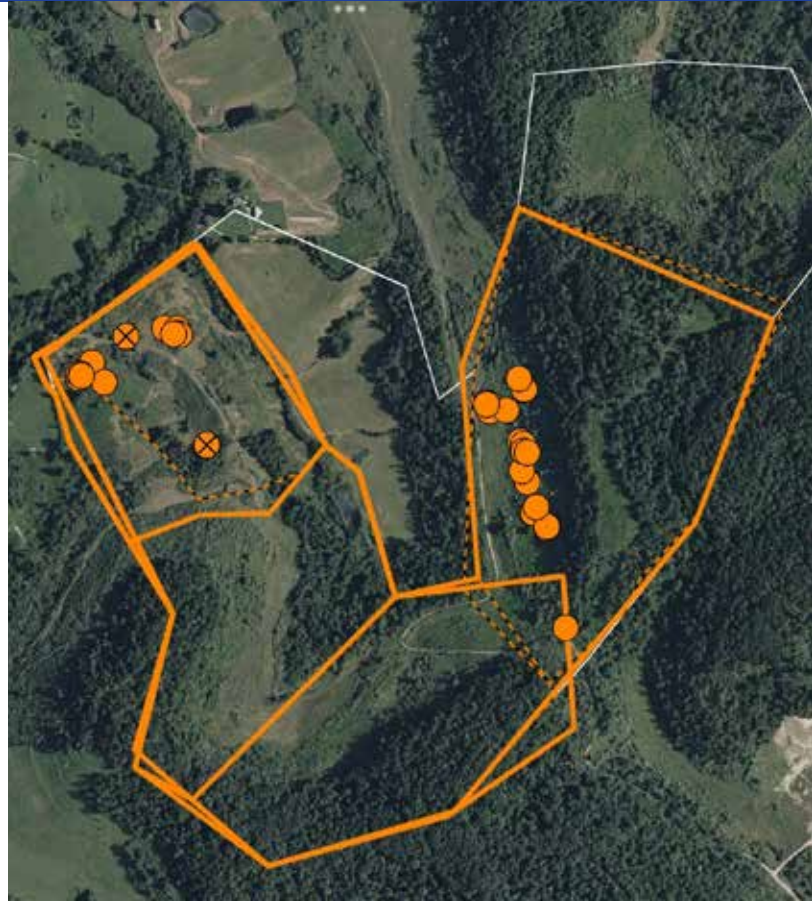




Member Spotlight



Creed Ward



An exciting new piece of technology caught the eye of West Virginia Cattlemen's Association member, Creed Ward, at the 2023 NCBA convention. While going through the trade show, Ward was able to learn more about virtual fence options he could bring back to his operation. He found different companies offer different options from cellular coverage to base tower coverage. There are also options available for cattle, sheep and goats.

Like many other farmers, Creed was renting property which would soon be coming up for sale. The idea of virtual fence would allow him to run cattle on the property without investing in materials and time that would soon no longer be available. The virtual fence also opens the ability to do rotational grazing. For example, the virtual fence can be set up to replace moving polywire fence daily. Producers have the capability to draw the lines, virtual fence, on your mobile device.

Ward decided to try his first set of collars in June 2025. Since then, he has found the cattle are easily trained and very well controlled.

"There may be limiting factors for some, but this is a technology that works, and in our situation, it has proven to be very effective and easy to train the cattle," Ward said. 🐄

Nominate Your Neighbor for 2026 Environmental Stewardship Award



Prestigious Award Program Recognizes Stewardship Efforts of Cattle Producers

CENTENNIAL, Colo. (Oct. 15, 2025) – The National Cattlemen’s Beef Association (NCBA) is accepting nominations for the 2026 Environmental Stewardship Awards. Established in 1991, the Environmental Stewardship Award Program (ESAP) annually recognizes outstanding stewardship practices and conservation achievements of cattle producers across the country.

“Since its inception 35 years ago, this prestigious program has recognized 235 cattle operations for their stewardship efforts,” said NCBA President Buck Wehrbein. “We look forward to finding the next deserving stewards and sharing their stories.”

Any individual, group or organization is eligible to nominate one individual or business raising or feeding cattle.

While individuals and families may not nominate themselves, they should be involved in the preparation of the application. Past nominees are encouraged to resubmit applications; however, previous winners may not reapply.

Along with a typed application, one nomination letter and three letters of recommendation highlighting the nominee’s leadership in conservation are required. The application deadline is Feb. 16, 2026. Nominees do not have to be members of NCBA but should support the objectives of their state and national organization.

Award winners are selected by a committee of representatives from universities, cattle production, conservation organizations as well as federal and state agencies. For

guidance, the judges consider the management of water, wildlife, vegetation, air, and soil along with leadership abilities and the sustainability of the business. Regional winners will be recognized at the cattle industry’s Summer Business Meeting in Denver, Colorado, in July 2026, and the national winner will be announced during CattleCon 2027 in Nashville, Tennessee, in February 2027.

The Environmental Stewardship Award Program is an initiative of the National Cattlemen’s Beef Association and the National Cattlemen’s Foundation and is made possible with generous support from USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Corteva Agriscience, and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.
